CALENDAR FOR THE WEEK AHEAD

Sunday 2nd The Church grows in the fear of the Lord, filled with the consolation of the Holy Spirit. The Father watches over the growth of the vine, that it may bear more fruit. Faith, love and obedience to the commandments give life.

Monday 3rd St Philip and St James, Apostles. Philip, who asked to see the Father, was told by Jesus: 'To have seen me is to have seen the Father'. James, the son of Alphaeus and perhaps a relation of Jesus, may have become the leader of the Church in Jerusalem and been martyred there.

Tuesday 4th St Conleth. A hermit, who became a co-worker with St Brigid, was bishop and abbot of the monks of Kildare, and was buried beside Brigid in the great church there.

Wednesday 5th Blessed Edmund Ignatius Rice (1762-1844). From Callan in County Kilkenny. After his young wife's early death, he sold his possessions and dedicated his life to the education of the poor. He gathered other likeminded men around him, who took religious vows together to work for the Catholic education of boys. A model of patient and cheerful acceptance of suffering, a true lay apostle and a deeply committed religious.

Friday 7th Hour of Sacred / Meditative Music, from St Pius X Church, from 8-9 pm.

Saturday 8th Blessed John Sullivan Born in Dublin on 8 May 1861. He was baptised in St George's Church of Ireland, and was received into the Catholic Church at the age of 35. He was ordained priest in the Society of Jesus in 1907. He spent the greater part of his life in Clongowes Wood College, Co Kildare where his reputation for holiness spread rapidly as he was always available to the sick, the poor or anyone in need. He died 19 February 1933 and was beatified in St Francis Xavier Church, Dublin 13 May 2017. His was the first beatification ceremony to be celebrated in Ireland.
