Sunday 8th The door is closed against the bridesmaids who did not keep vigil nor trim their lamps. The concern of the Christian should be readiness for the call of the Lord, to seek the light of Christ in daily living and to keep burning brightly the light received at baptism. It is true wisdom to be always eagerly longing for the Lord.

Monday 9th Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica. This church in Rome is known as "the mother and head of all the churches in the city and in the world". It is the Cathedral Church of the diocese of Rome where Pope Francis is Bishop.

Tuesday 10th Pope St Leo the Great. Pope (440-461). A gifted pastor and teacher, who intervened decisively at the Council of Chalcedon in 451 in defence of the doctrine of the Incarnation.

Wednesday 11th St Martin of Tours (317-397). Born in Hungary, educated in Italy, baptized a Christian at the age of 20. Took up the life of a hermit in France and set up the first monastery there.

Thursday 12th St Josaphat (1580-1623). A bishop who worked for the reunification of Christian groups in Eastern Europe and died a martyr's death in 1623.

Saturday 14th St Laurence O'Toole (1123-80). Monk and Abbot of Glendalough, he became Archbishop of Dublin in 1162. He continued the movement of reform begun by Ceallach and Malachy. He died in Eu in Brittany in 1180 while on a mission to restore peace between the kings of Ireland and England.

Indulgences for the faithful departed: to avoid the gathering of large numbers of people, a Plenary Indulgence applicable to the dead may be obtained throughout the month of November by anyone who visits a cemetery and prays devoutly for the deceased. If you cannot get to a cemetery you can still obtain the Indulgence by visiting the cemetery in your thoughts and prayers. It will also be possible to obtain a Plenary Indulgence for the dead on any day of the month of November by devoutly visiting a church or oratory and reciting there one Our Father and the Apostle's Creed, and praying for the Pope's intentions. The housebound can do so by, ideally in the presence of an image of Jesus or the Blessed Virgin Mary, praying the Rosary, the Divine Mercy chaplet, meditating on Gospel passages relating to our faith in the Resurrection, or performing a work of mercy / kindness / generosity, or offering one's sufferings and discomforts to God for the benefit of the souls in Purgatory.

A prayer for vocations: That those called to serve the Lord and His people as priests, deacons and in the consecrated life will be blessed with holy zeal in their prayers and ministry. We pray to the Lord.

Mass this week: every day (except Saturday) at 10am.
