St Joseph, the "father in the shadows."

Continuing his meditation on St Joseph, Pope Francis sees the saint as someone who not only sacrifices himself, but who also gives himself, in trust, to the will of God. He offers St Joseph to fathers as a model of humble service to their children, a service which is characterised by the proper use of power and authority, tempered with charity and discussion. These qualities prevent fathers who sacrifice so much for their children from becoming unhappy, sad or frustrated. Pope Francis says that a father should respect his child's freedom, and encourage his child to become independent. Christian fathers do not possess their children; rather they act in the name of God the Father.

The diocese of Derry will celebrate a **Novena of Prayer for Vocations** from Saturday 17 April – Sunday 25 April (Good Shepherd Sunday). The resources for the Novena, which contain prayers for daily Mass, as well as devotional reflections for the Angelus, the Rosary, a daily Examen, and reflections on St Joseph will be available at <u>www.derrydiocese.org</u> and <u>www.derryvocations.org</u> Also, on the evenings of Monday 19 April – Friday 23 April, Bishop McKeown will interview a number of people on various aspects of vocation, followed by a daily Examen, Mass, and the Rosary, all of which will be broadcast on the diocesan websites mentioned above.
