THIS WEEK'S CALENDAR

Sunday 11th We gather to celebrate the Eucharist, which is a celebration in hope and joy as a foretaste of the heavenly banquet. To take part in it is a grace and a privilege. But we must wear the wedding garment of sinlessness and obedience to God's will. Many before us have been called to the feast but failed to stay.

Wednesday 14th St Callistus I, after a life of slavery and imprisonment for criminal offences, was freed and became a deacon in charge of catacombs that bear his name. he became Pope in 217 and died at the hands of a mob in 222.

Thursday 15th St **Teresa of Avila** (1515-1582) deeply contemplative, highly active and practical, established Carmelite convents under a reformed rule and wrote much on prayer and the spiritual life. Patron of Spain.

Friday 16th St Margaret Mary (1647-1690) visionary and ascetic, revived devotion to the Sacred Heart and was exemplary in her patience and trust.

St Gall was a monk of Bangor and set out with Columbanus for the continent. When Columbanus was exiled from France Gall accompanied him to Bregenz on Lake Constance. When Columbanus crossed into Italy, Gall remained in Switzerland. He lived in a hermitage which later became the monastery of St Gallen, He died around 630.

St Hedwig (1174-1243) wife of the Duke of Silesia, mother of seven children, some of whom caused her trouble, devoted herself to charitable works.

Saturday 17th St Ignatius, bishop of Antioch, died a martyr at Rome around 107. He urged Christians to unity in and around the Eucharist and their local bishop.

Pray the Rosary

Archbishop Eamon Martin is asking families to pray the Rosary together for the month of October in what is called the **Family Rosary Crusade**.

Today, Sunday 11 October, the Rosary on the Coast for Life & Faith will take place in Ireland and in many other countries. The faithful are invited to gather on coasts, at grottos, churches, river banks, in their homes, or wherever they can to pray the Rosary **safely**, at 2.30pm. Here, we can do so in the comfort of our own homes. It would be wonderful to unite the parish in prayer at that time.

The "Zoom Family Rosary" is an initiative of two Irish families, which allows people all over the world to pray the Rosary together, using mobile phones, tablets, laptops or desktop computers. The link is: http://bit.ly/ZoomFamilyRosary which will bring you to a webpage where you can register.

Taking its inspiration from Pope St John Paul II's call for people to use modern technology to share the message of Christ with others, each session begins with a short music video, which is aimed at children. The person leading the Rosary invites children from different families to pray each decade. The Rosary lasts for about 20 minutes, and finishes with an invitation for everyone to take part in a short, friendly chat at the end, if they wish to do so. It takes place at 6pm (Irish time) every Saturday, and everyone is welcome to join in.

Dáil Éireann is currently debating the **so-called "Dying with Dignity" Bill** which, if passed, would fully legalise euthanasia and assisted suicide. While there seems to be a relentless push for this legislation in the media and among some TDs, many doctors who could be tasked with actually administering lethal drugs remain overwhelmingly opposed.

The Irish Palliative Medicine Consultants' Association, the Royal College of Physicians in Ireland, and The Association for Palliative Medicine of Britain and Ireland have all made clear their opposition to this Bill. In countries in which similar laws have been enacted, the number of people dying by euthanasia increases exponentially in a short period of time.

As Catholics we're called to be pro-life, respecting God's gift of life from the moment of conception right up to the moment of natural death. At a time when this is being threatened we're called to pray for our legislators, that God's Holy Spirit will guide them to choose life and to protect the most vulnerable of our brothers and sisters.

A prayer for vocations

That from the many called to holiness in Christ, those chosen to follow Him in the priesthood and consecrated life will respond with humble readiness.
