## CALENDAR FOR THE WEEK AHEAD

**Sunday 16<sup>th</sup>** There is a great mystery in the will of God that all will be saved. He knows the minds and hearts of all and does not judge in a human way. We hold to that belief in the need of membership for salvation, but we do so in the light of the universality of salvation. Like the Canaanite woman we must persevere with a determined faith in seeking the truth in love, until all nations learn of God's salvation and all peoples praise his name.

**Monday 17<sup>th</sup> Our Lady of Knock.** The story of Knock began on 21 August 1879 when Our Lady, St Joseph and St John the Evangelist appeared at the south gable of Knock Paris Church. This miraculous apparition was witnessed by fifteen people, young and old. Knock is an internationally recognised Marian shrine and was visited by Pope St. John Paul II as part of his 1979 pilgrimage to Ireland, and by Pope Francis when he visited Ireland for the World Meeting of Families in 2018.

**Wednesday 19<sup>th</sup> St John Eudes** (1601-1680), from Normandy, spent a fruitful twenty years with the French Oratory. He founded a congregation to improve the standards of the clergy through seminaries. He also founded the Sisters of Our Lady of Charity and Refuge. A powerful preacher, he was among the first to promote devotion to the Sacred Heart.

**Thursday 20<sup>th</sup> St Bernard** (1090-1153) became a Cistercian monk in 1113 and was chosen Abbot of Clairvaux in 1115. His writings reveal a solid grasp of biblical studies, spiritual theology and philosophy. Patron of Gibraltar and beekeepers.

**Friday 21<sup>st</sup> St Pius X** (1835-1914) became Pope in 1903. He encouraged pastoral liturgy and sacramental practice, especially of frequent communion to which he admitted young children.

**Bishop Donal McKeown** hopes to visit the parish on Friday, and will celebrate the 10am Mass in St. Pius X Church.

**Saturday 22<sup>nd</sup> The Queenship of Mary.** During the Middle Ages, Mary was venerated as queen of the angels and saints. Pope Pius XII prescribed the memorial for the universal church in 1955, at the close of the Marian Year. Its place on this date to stress the connection of Mary's queenship with the Assumption.
