Sunday 20th At the Annunciation Mary consents to become the Mother of Jesus, who is the Son of the Most High and a descendant of David. In Jesus, God's promise to David will be fulfilled and his plan will be revealed.

Monday 21st St Peter Canisius (1521-97), was a Dutch Jesuit. He gently promoted the Catholic revival after the Council of Trent. His greatest work was a catechism of 211 questions and answers, published in 1555.

Wednesday 23rd St John of Kanty (1390-1473), taught theology and scripture in Krakow, Poland. He is remembered for his generosity and his austerity of life.

Thursday 24th Christmas Eve. Mass at 4pm, 5.30pm, 7pm & 9pm.

Friday 25th Christmas Day. Mass at 8am, 9.30am & 11am.



Saturday 26th St Stephen, the first Christian Martyr, was one of those in charge of the poor and needy. He is outstanding for his forgiveness of his enemies. Patron of deacons, stonemasons and bricklayers.

Sunday 27th The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph is seen as a model for the human family, the religious community and the Church itself.

Responsorial Psalm: He, the Lord, is our God. He remembers his covenant for ever.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, Alleluia! At various times in the past and in various different ways, God spoke to our ancestors through the prophets; but in our time, the last days, he has spoken to us through his Son. Alleluia.

Monday 28th The Holy Innocents, Martyrs. We celebrate the children killed at the command of King Herod who had hoped to include Jesus among them. The Holy Family escaped into Egypt. Mass at 10am.

Tuesday 29th St Thomas Beckett (1118-1170) As Archbishop of Cantebury, he came in conflict with King Henry II over Church rights. He was killed in his cathedral on this date. Mass at 10am.

Thursday 31st St Sylvester, Pope. Died in 335 after being Pope for twenty-one years. Elected in the year after the Edict of Milan, he was free to build many churches in Rome. Mass at 10am.

Friday 1st January 2021 Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God. The oldest feast of Mary in the Roman Rite. Today is World Day of Peace. Mass at 11am.

Saturday 2nd St Basil the Great and St Gregory of Nazianzus, bishops and doctors of the Church. Especially venerated in the Eastern Church.
