**Sunday 23<sup>rd</sup>** Because of Peter's faith the promise is given to him. It is through faith that the Church at all times can have trust in the promise of God's protective power. **Monday 24**<sup>th</sup> St Bartholomew, Apostle. Probably to be identified with Nathanael of Cana, whom Philip brought to Jesus. Said to have preached the Gospel in India. Patron saint of plasterers, tanners and leatherworkers.

**Tuesday 25<sup>th</sup>** St Louis of France (1214-70). King of France, father of eleven children, Franciscan tertiary, man of integrity, died in Tunisia on his second crusade.

St Joseph Calasanz (1556-1648) founded the Piarists to run free schools. Patron of Catholic schools.

**Thursday 27<sup>th</sup> St** Monica (332-387). Converted her pagan husband, Patricius, to the faith and, by her prayers and her tears brought her son, St Augustine, to Christianity. Patron saint of mothers.

**Friday 28<sup>th</sup>** St Augustine (354-430). Bishop of Hippo in North Africa. An outstanding thinker, preacher and pastoral bishop. One of the most significant theological influences in the history of the western Church. Patron of theologians.

**Saturday 29<sup>th</sup>** The Beheading of St John the Baptist. John prepared the way for Christ and bore witness to him when he came. His martyr's death was his last and greatest act of witness.
