**Sunday 25<sup>th</sup>** On the twofold commandment of love hang the whole of the Jewish Law, and the prophets also – a commandment that Jesus taught not only in his words but by his life and death also.

**Tuesday 27<sup>th</sup> St Otteran (Odhran).** A descendant of Conall Gulban, he preceded Colum Cille in Iona, where his grave was greatly revered. Chosen by the Vikings as patron of Waterford in 1096.

Wednesday 28<sup>th</sup> Sts Simon and Jude, apostles. Nothing is known of Simon except that he was born in Cana and was called the Zealot. Jude, also known as Thaddeus, was the apostle who asked the Lord at the Last Supper why he showed himself only to his disciples and not to the world.

**Thursday 29<sup>th</sup> St Colman**, bishop. From Kilmacduagh, Co Clare, he founded two churches in Aran, on Inis Mhór, before returning to Kilmacduagh to make a further foundation there.

**Saturday 31<sup>st</sup> Blessed Dominic Collins** (1566-1602) was born in Youghal, Co. Cork. After a military career he joined the Jesuits as a Brother. He was captured in 1602 by the English who tried to make him abjure his faith. He was martyred in Youghal on 31 October 1602.

The Irish bishops have asked that every parish would celebrate a **Service to dedicate November as a month of Prayer and Remembrance for the dead and the bereaved** on Sunday 1 November 2020, at 3pm. Our parish Service will take place in St. Pius X Church, and will be broadcast live on the parish webcam. As a parish community, we will remember in particular all those who have died in the past twelve months.

Under Level 5 Covid regulations, funerals may proceed with up to 25 mourners present in the church. Otherwise, churches will remain open for private prayer only. No organised indoor or outdoor events are permitted. Furthermore, Bishop McKeown has written to the priests of the Inis Eoghain deanery to advise us that, if a wake is open to non-family members, we should not attend the house, but that a member of the family should liaise with us to help organise the funeral Mass or service and burial.

Regular **visitation of the sick and housebound** is currently suspended, but if anyone would like Fr Pat to call at the house to attend to someone who's sick, or for any other pastoral reason, please get in touch. Please God, it may be possible to resume normal visitation in December.
