THIS WEEK'S CALENDAR

Sunday 27th A short parable with a very sharp point. It was not the establishment figures of Judaism, the well placed, the "great and good" who obeyed God's word but rather the poor and weak, sinners, tax collectors, prostitutes. Jesus' parable tells every Christian and the institution of the Church: Words are not enough – God looks for actions.

Monday 28th St Lawrence Ruiz and companions: sixteen Christians, European and Asian, lay, clerical and religious, men and women, who in various times and circumstances worked for the spread of the faith in the Philippine Islands, Formosa and Japan, martyred in the Japanese city of Nagasaki between 1633 and 1637.

Tuesday 29th Saints Michael, Gabriel and Raphael, the three Archangels mentioned by name in the scriptures. Gabriel brought God's message to Mary in the Annunciation; Raphael was guide to Tobias and was instrumental in curing the blindness of his father; Michael is the great protector of God's people. The name Michael means "who is like God"; Raphael "God heals" and Gabriel "God is strong".

Wednesday 30th St Jerome (340-420). A man of great asceticism and great learning, he translated the Bible into Latin and wrote a number of scripture commentaries.

Thursday 1st October St Thérèse of the Lisieux. Marie François Thérèse Martin died at the Carmelite Convent in Lisieux on 30 September 1897. She was declared a Doctor of the Church by Pope John Paul II in 1997, and is the patron of the Missions, florists, aviators and France.

Friday 2nd The Guardian Angels, through whom God loves, protects and guides us.

Saturday 3rd Blessed Columba Marmion (1858-1923). A Dublin priest, who later joined the Benedictines and became Abbot of Maredsous in Belgium. Through his writings he has had an influence far beyond his monastery and for long after his death. Beatified in 2000.

Sunday 4th First Anniversary Mass for Patrick Harkin at 10am.

A message from Bishop McKeown to the priests and people of the Inis Eoghain parishes of the diocese of Derry:

The Government has moved County Donegal COVID-19 restrictions to level 3. This has many implications for churches:

1. Churches may open for private prayer only.

2. Weddings can be celebrated with no more than 25 people present, which is an all-inclusive number;

3. Funerals can be celebrated with no more than 25 people present, which is an all-inclusive number.

No public Masses, sacraments or other Services may be celebrated with people present. These restrictions apply until 16 October.

It is so disappointing to see this development, but County Donegal has experienced an exceptionally high level of COVID-19 infection. We keep in our prayers the preservation of life and live in hope of the speedy release of these restrictions.
